## STEM WEEK

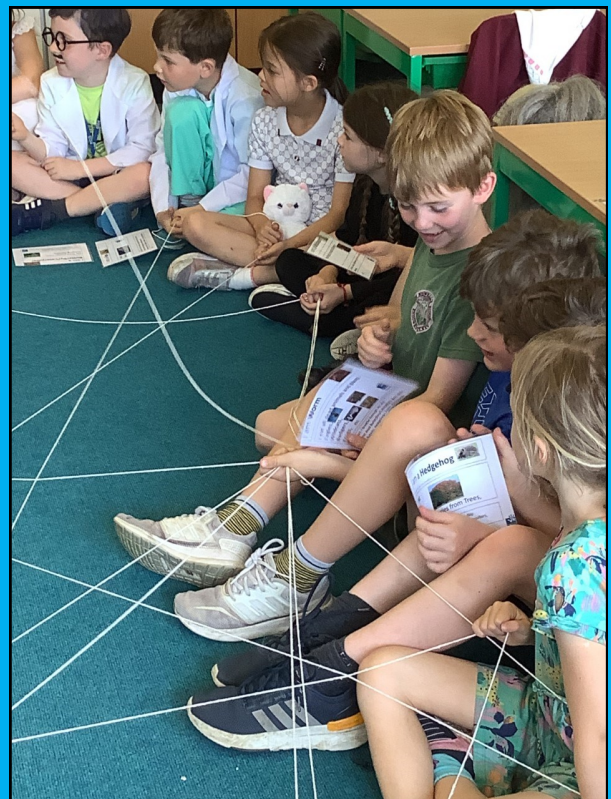
STEM Week has, as ever, proved a huge success. The children have certainly been fired up by all the fascinating and stimulating activities in which they have been involved.

Right and below: Years 1 and 2 were visited by Hands-On Science who helped the children to focus on the importance of bio-diversity.

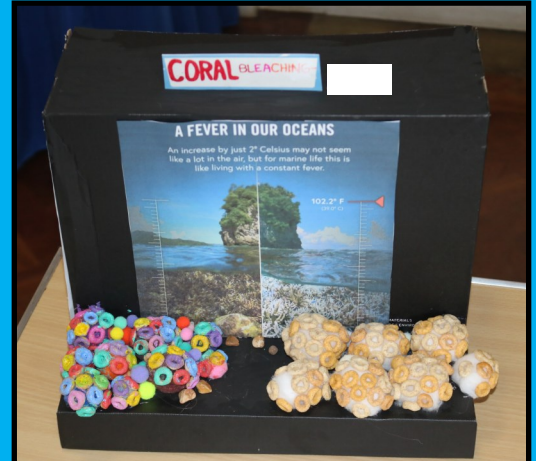
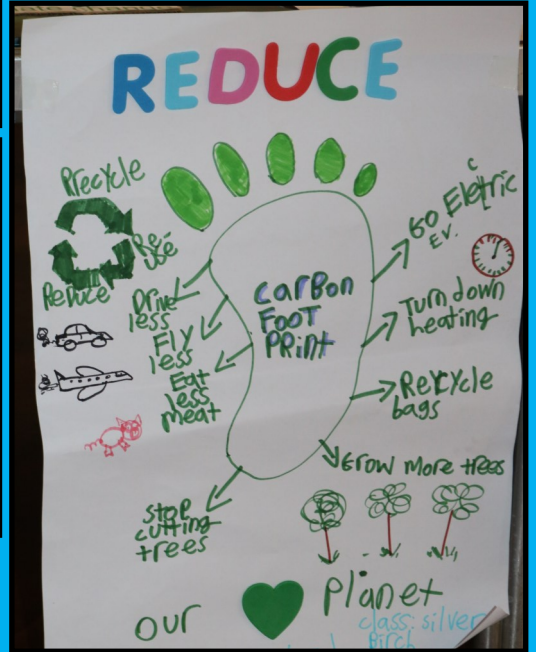


## STEM WEEK CONT'D ...
