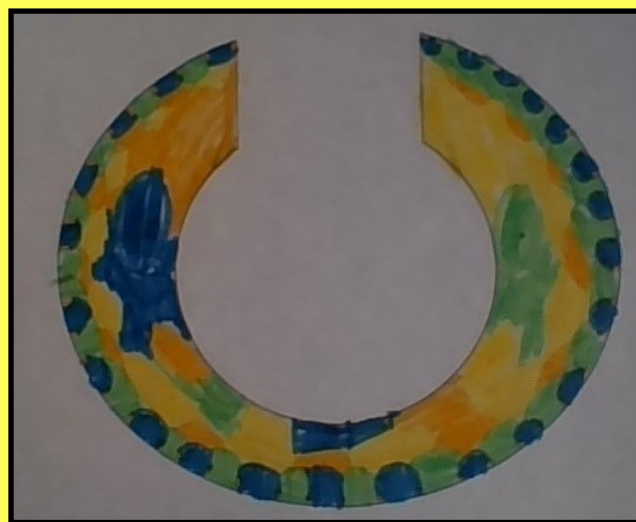
They are currently on the move to different year groups and classes for the duration of Term 4, but will be returning to their original classes after Easter.

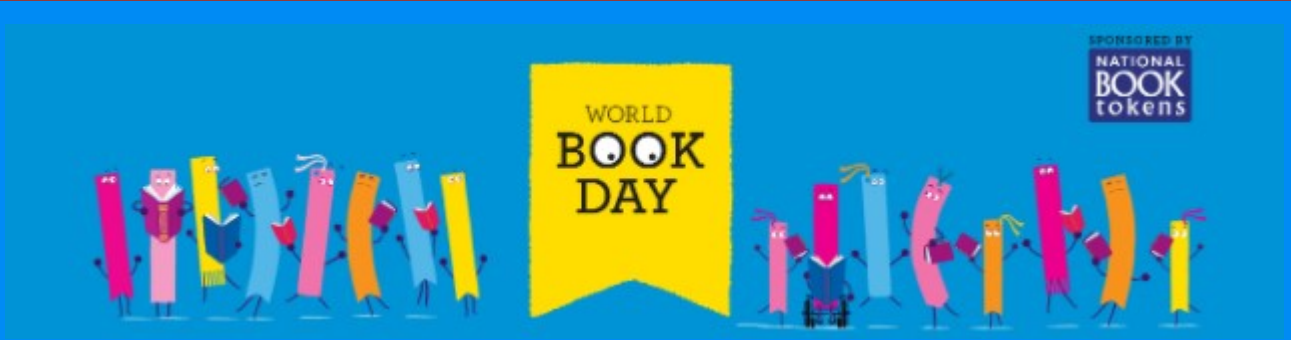

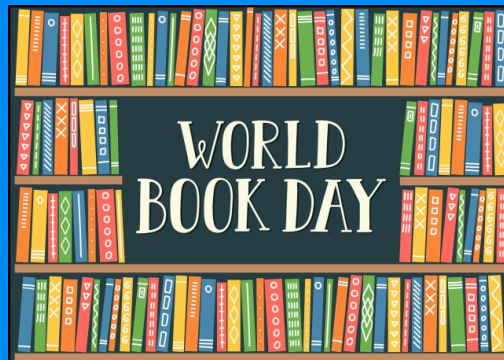

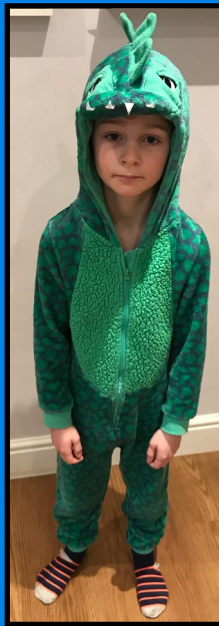
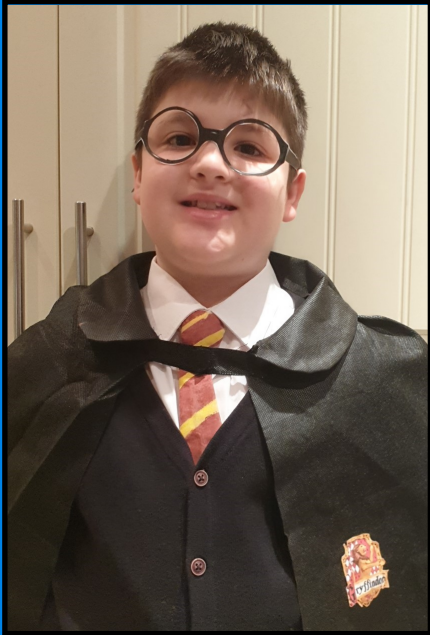

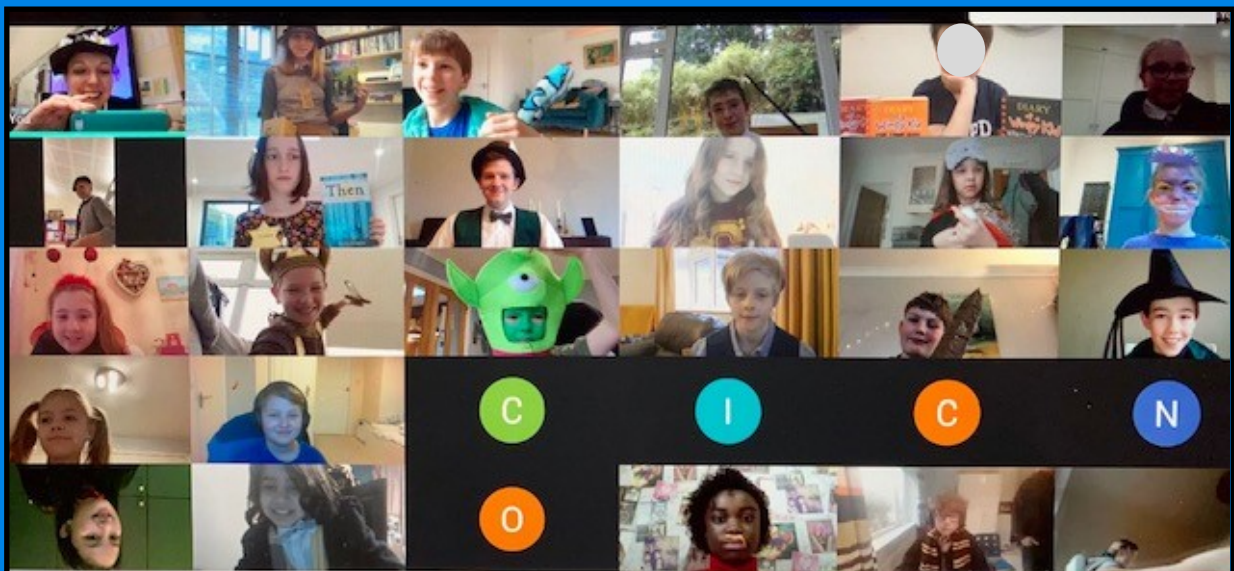

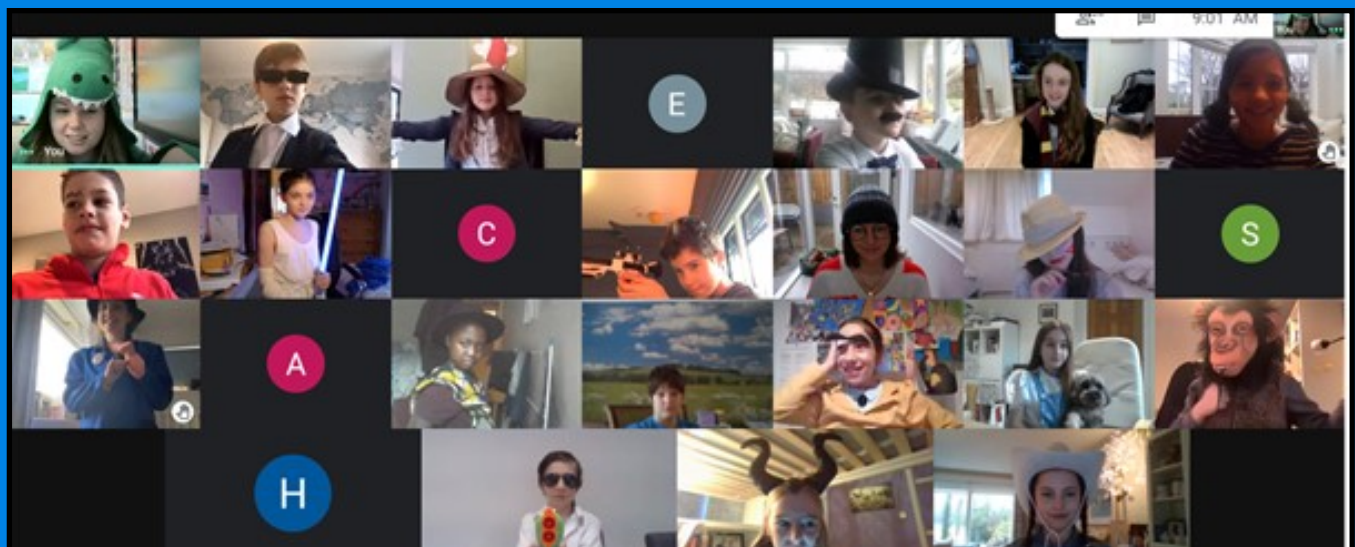
