YEAR 3 TRIP TO BUTSER FARM



Year 3 visited Butser Ancient Farm on Wednesday to start off this term's Topic 'Stone Age to the Iron Age'. The children were able to visit and explore a Stone Age Hut, became archaeologists, experienced prehistoric construction using 'wattling' and 'daubing' techniques to help build a wall. A number of beautiful Stone Age inspired clay pots were also hand-crafted by the children.

The children had a fantastic time and represented the school brilliantly, 'wowing' the Butser Farm staff with their knowledge and enthusiasm. We would like to thank the parent volunteers who joined us on the trip; we thoroughly appreciate the time they have given up to enable the children to benefit from such a fun filled trip.



YEAR 6 WW2 TRIP TO KNOLE

On Monday, the Year 6 children visited Knole as part of their WW2 topic. One half of the day provided an opportunity to examine artefacts belonging to different people on the Home Front, to look at a variety of uniforms (with a great deal of fun trying them on!), and a chance to learn more about Captain Sackville-West and his role in WW2 through personal artefacts. The other half of the day allowed the children to use the park to discover more about Knole's role in the war as a base for many military vehicles looked after by ATS girls. The children were praised by the Knole staff and volunteers for their behaviour. We would like to thank the parents who accompanied us on the trip for their help.

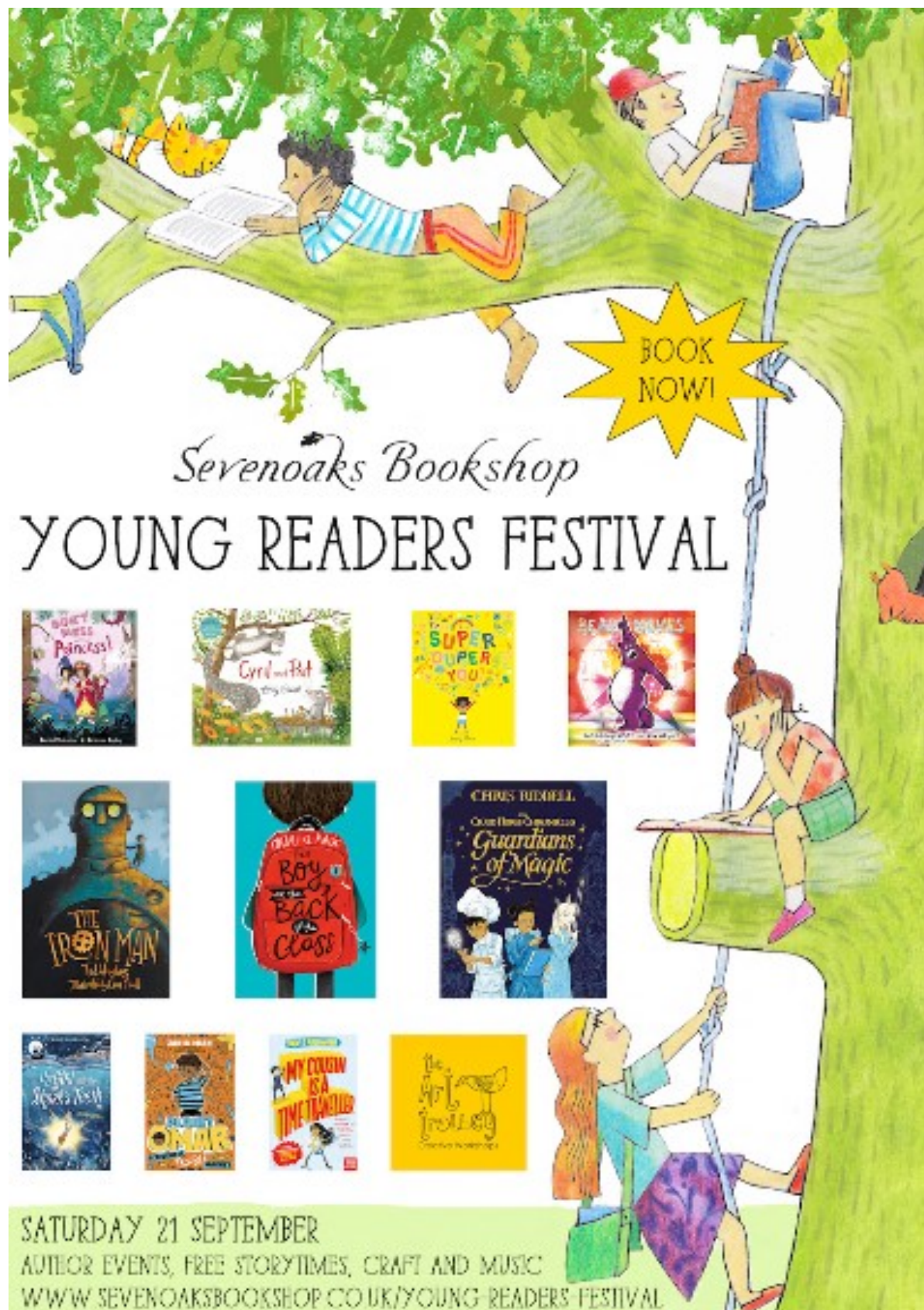
