Key achievements to date:

- Over 40 competitions were entered throughout the year including hockey, football, netball, cricket, dance, athletics, district sports, swimming gala, handball and many more.
- We attended new tennis tournaments and used the local tennis club courts for year 6 interhouse.
- We provided children with sports enrichment (clubs).
- Attended PE conference to be updated on the latest news and attended 3 workshops.
- Interhouse tournaments took place including cross-country for KS1.
- New Sports day format was introduced (Carousel format)
- KS1 and KS2 sports days on separate mornings.
- We led District swimming gala.
- Held year 4-6 swimming gala
- Held year 3 fun swim
- Updated shed padlock/ramp/lights
- We have introduced a new scheme of work 'Greenacre'.
- Continue to develop our Forest school programme.
- Attended district sports meeting, communicating with other PE leads across a range of schools.
- Ran sports team photos.
- Year 6 vs staff end of year netball match.
- Helped to organise and select children for clubs in order to ensure all children have at least one sports club if they wish.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Continue to enhance the opportunities for our less active and other targeted groups through more alternative sports.
- Employ a sports enrichment assistant to support with extra-curricular sporting activities.
- All year 6 pupils to attend an open water swimming day.
- Develop PE curriculum further to incorporate social and emotional development and mental health awareness- tying into thrive and ruler.
- Introduce warm-up ideas attached to PE trolleys to encourage more creativity.
- To monitor Class teachers lessons more consistently by lesson observations and discussions.
- Continue to run year group interhouses- adding house points for rewards.
- Continue to have medals for record breakers on sports day and sportsmanship awards.
- Continue to develop outdoor learning and forest school to ensure children utilise our grounds and benefit from the positive outcomes.
- Continue to run a staff vs year 6 sports match at the end of the year.
